Clark County Fairgrounds Revised Camping Rules

(Non-Fair Events)

August 1, 2021

- 1. All campers must pay for each 24-Hour period onsite.
- 2. Open campfires are not permitted.
- 3. Maintain a clean campsite.
- 4. All campers must be equipped with a fire extinguisher.
- 5. No Extension cords to campers.
- 6. Now sewer or water hookups. There are 2 water fill stations and 2 dump stations on the grounds.
- 7. All pets must be on a leash at all times.
- 8. No livestock permitted in the campsites at any time.
- 9. The designated "Quiet Hours" are from Midnight to 6:30 am.
- 10. You are responsible for any damage to County property.
- 11. You must abide by any other County or State regulations.
- 12. Neither the Clark County Agricultural Society or it's Directors are responsible for any loss or damage to your camper.

<u>Information from the Champions Center</u>

Please Read

As an organization, the Champions Center continues to strive to provide our customers with unparalleled service, as we have since opening in 2004. However, we have been remiss in explaining our relationship regarding the location of our facility on the Clark County Fairgrounds and how it impacts all of our customers.

The Clark County Fairgrounds is owned by the residents of the County and under the control of the Clark County Commission. The day to day operations and management of the Fairgrounds are the responsibility of the Clark County Fair Board, as outlined in the Ohio Revised Code. The Champions Center and the covered outdoor arena are located on 17 acres of the fairgrounds that the Champions Center leases from the Clark County Commission.

The reasons for the explanation are the following:

- 1. The Fair Board is responsible for adhering to all of the rules and regulations for the campgrounds as outlined by the State of Ohio Director of Health and are responsible for posting the camping rules (see attached). Pay special attention to Rule 6.
- 2. Thus it is the responsibility of The Champions Center and our customers to abide by those rules since the campgrounds are not part of our leased acreage. We work with the fairgrounds to ensure that we are in compliance.
- 3. Although some of the rules have not been enforced in the past, recent visits from the Health Department, resulting in several violations, have made it necessary to adhere to all Camping Rules and Regulations.
